

West Vancouver Consultation

Highway Improvement Design Options

Improvements for the 7 km section of the Sea-to-Sky Highway from east of Eagle Ridge to Sunset Beach are designed to improve safety, reliability and capacity, consistent with goals for the overall project. Four options have been developed for input and feedback from the community. Options address project goals and community concerns to varying degrees. Each option will be visually presented to the community and stakeholders with summary information about the key characteristics such as access, costs, benefits and how each option addresses project goals and community concerns.

The Design Options

Option A – Two northbound lanes upslope

Two northbound lanes use a new route constructed upslope. Two southbound lanes use the existing Highway 99 route.

Option B – Four upslope lanes

Four new lanes upslope from the existing Highway 99 corridor. The existing Highway 99 serves local traffic.

Option C - Northbound tunnel

Two-lane northbound tunnel. Southbound traffic uses existing Highway 99 route.

Option D - Two-way, two-lane tunnel

Two-way, two-lane tunnel. One lane northbound and one lane southbound. The existing Highway 99 serves local traffic.

West Vancouver Consultation Goals

The goals of the Preliminary Design Consultation with West Vancouver are to:

- a. **Inform the community and stakeholders about the design options** for improvements to the Sea-to-Sky Highway within West Vancouver
- b. **Gather input and feedback** regarding the design options for highway improvements from the community and stakeholders
- c. **Summarize community and stakeholders input** for consideration by the Ministry of Transportation. Distribute the *Consultation Summary Report* to consultation participants, West Vancouver City Council and other stakeholders.

Consultation Methods

Small Group Meetings - The Ministry of Transportation will consult with local government officials, residents, businesses and community stakeholders through a series of small group meetings. Highway improvement options will be presented through a power-point presentation and display boards, and input will be gathered through a feedback form.

Open Houses - The Ministry of Transportation will consult with the broader public through open houses in two locations to gather local area feedback. Highway improvement options will be presented through display boards, and input will be gathered through a feedback form.

Web-based Feedback form - The Ministry of Transportation will gather public input via a web-based feedback form. A power-point presentation and display boards will be posted on www.seatoskyimprovements.ca

Community and Stakeholder Input

Community and Stakeholder input will be recorded and summarized into a *Consultation Summary Report* for consideration by the Ministry of Transportation and for distribution to consultation participants including the City of West Vancouver and other stakeholders.
