

Landscape Option A – Native Planting Restoration

① North of CN Rail Overpass

Existing Forest | Shrubs On Slope | 2 South-bound Lanes | 1 North-bound Lane | Shrubs On Slope | Existing Forest

② Gateway Treatment Area

Existing Forest | Banners On Slope | 2 South-bound Lanes | 2 North-bound Lanes | Banners On Slope | Existing Forest

- The approach to the gateway in Option A is to use banner poles to provide special identity to the Whistler area. The gateway would include closely spaced banner poles beyond the gateway sign. One advantage to this approach would be that the banners would remain highly visible even with the growth of the adjacent forest.
- The roadside and slope landscape treatment in Option A restores the native vegetation of the surrounding forest. Native trees and shrubs would be planted in clusters to encourage natural succession. Care would be taken in the selection of plants to avoid species that are particularly attractive to bears.

Landscape Option B – Street Trees

① North of CN Rail Overpass

Existing Forest | Shrubs On Slope | 2 South-bound Lanes | 1 North-bound Lane | Shrubs On Slope | Existing Forest

② Gateway Treatment Area

Existing Forest | Trees On Slope | 2 South-bound Lanes | 2 North-bound Lanes | Trees On Slope | Existing Forest

- The approach to the gateway in Option B is to plant 5 to 6 trees close together in rows along each side of the road just beyond the gateway sign. The trees would be at or near the top of steep slopes.
- Option B would involve the planting of deciduous trees in lines along the roadside. Other roadside and sloped areas would be hydroseeded.

Landscape Option C – Flowering Ornamental Trees

① North of CN Rail Overpass

Existing Forest | Shrubs On Slope | 2 South-bound Lanes | 1 North-bound Lane | Shrubs On Slope | Existing Forest

② Gateway Treatment Area

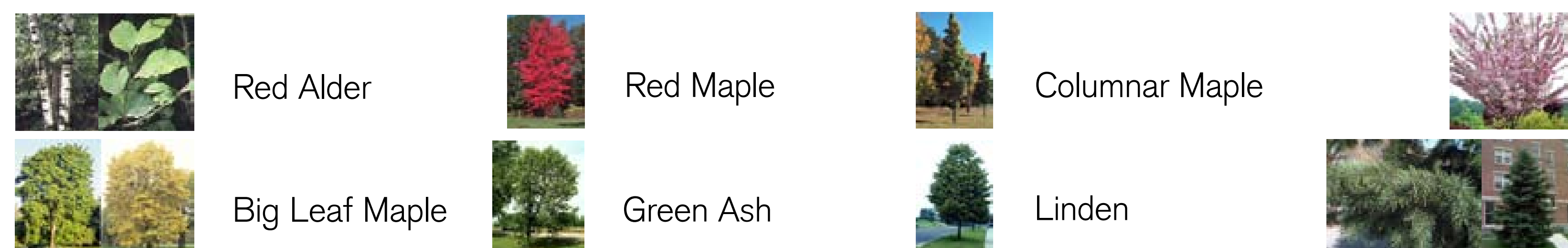
Existing Forest | Trees On Slope | 2 South-bound Lanes | 2 North-bound Lanes | Trees On Slope | Existing Forest

- The approach to the gateway in Option C is similar to Option B.
- Option C would involve the planting of clusters of ornamental flowering trees along the roadside. Other roadside and sloped areas would be hydroseeded.
