

The end result of construction just north of Horseshoe Bay may be difficult to envision as you drive by, but this is the site of the north junction. This is where the newly constructed four-lane highway section merges with the rebuilt 'old' highway. Shown below is a computer-generated image of the final highway design, including recent construction pictures.

When complete, this new highway layout will safely carry through traffic as well as separate traffic travelling to and from residential areas such as the Pasco Road area, Horseshoe Bay Village and the BC Ferry Terminal.

In order to achieve this, the existing highway will be relocated lower down the slope and a new access for Pasco Road residents will be constructed. Local northbound traffic from the old highway will access the Sea-to-Sky Highway via a new overpass. Traffic heading south to the ferries will continue on to the Caulfeild exit, turn westward on Highway 1 and take the ferries exit. Traffic heading north from the ferries can follow the signs to Exit 0 from the terminal and turn up the old highway from the Marine Drive overpass.
